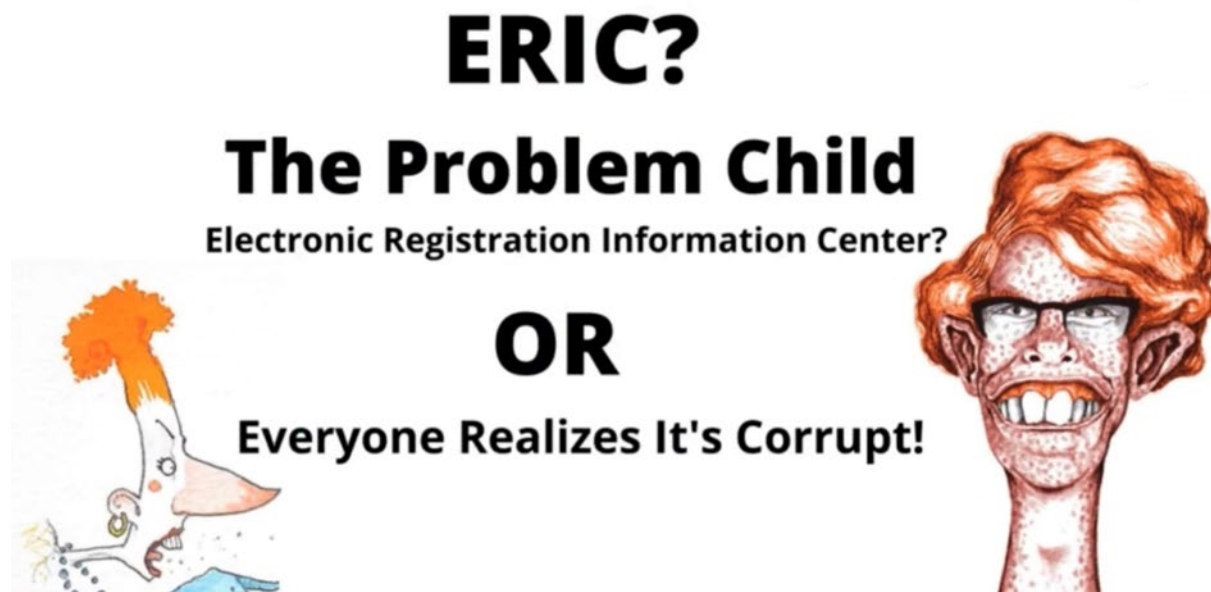
Overview

The findings and data presented in this report are based on analysis of election data available on the Maine Secretary of State and Census.gov websites by Mainers concerned with election integrity. We are regular folks making every effort to be accurate and concise. To that end we included our data tables compiled from official government reports at the end of this document. We invite interested parties to delve into this and all-available online data to establish their own understanding. Additional resources can be found listed on the reference page at its conclusion.

In what appears at best to be maladministration of Maine’s elections at the hands of those entrusted with the Peoples most important business we lay out multiple anomalies specific to the 2020 election that as of 2024 have yet to be addressed. We maintain, to

the detriment of the people of Maine and the entire nation, that the integrity of Maine's elections under the current system do nothing to ensure the integrity of the process nor the results are a true reflection of the wishes of the people. It is also important to note that under Secretary of State, Shenna Bellows, Maine entered into an official agreement with the Election Registration Information Center (ERIC) to assist in managing Maine's voter rolls. This occurred at a time when multiple states were ending their contracted association amid serious reservations about the service ERIC claims to provide member states vs what they do.

ERIC is a costly program that, among other things, promises to ease the burden on states of keeping accurate voter rolls. A close look reveals its beginnings stem from the Obama administration with George Soros funding. More importantly, a historical review of 4 years of data from Illinois, Oregon, Arkansas, and metro New York City, which totals over forty counties reveal the ERIC staff of just two individuals removed a paltry twelve outdated voter records from the collective voter rolls of these states. If you calculate the cost of the program per record it exceeds \$1,000,000 per record removed.

Law of the Land

Maine Constitution, Preamble

“We the People of Maine, in order to establish justice, insure tranquility, provide for our mutual defense, promote our common welfare, and secure to ourselves and our posterity the blessings of liberty, acknowledging with grateful hearts the goodness of the Sovereign Ruler of the Universe in affording us an opportunity, so favorable to the design; and, imploring God’s aid and direction in its accomplishment, do agree to form ourselves into a free and independent State, but the style and title of the State of Maine and do ordain and establish the following Constitution for the government of the same.”

Maine Constitution Article 1, Section 15

“The people have a right at all times, in an orderly and peaceable manner to assemble to consult upon the common good, to give instructions to their representatives, and to request, of either department of the government by written address or remonstrance, redress of their wrongs and grievances.”

Article 1, Section 2. Power inherent in people

“All power is inherent in the people; all free governments are founded in their authority and instituted for their benefit; they have therefore an unalienable and infeasible right to institute government, and to alter, reform, or totally change the same, when their safety and happiness require it.”

Article 1, Section 1 Natural rights.

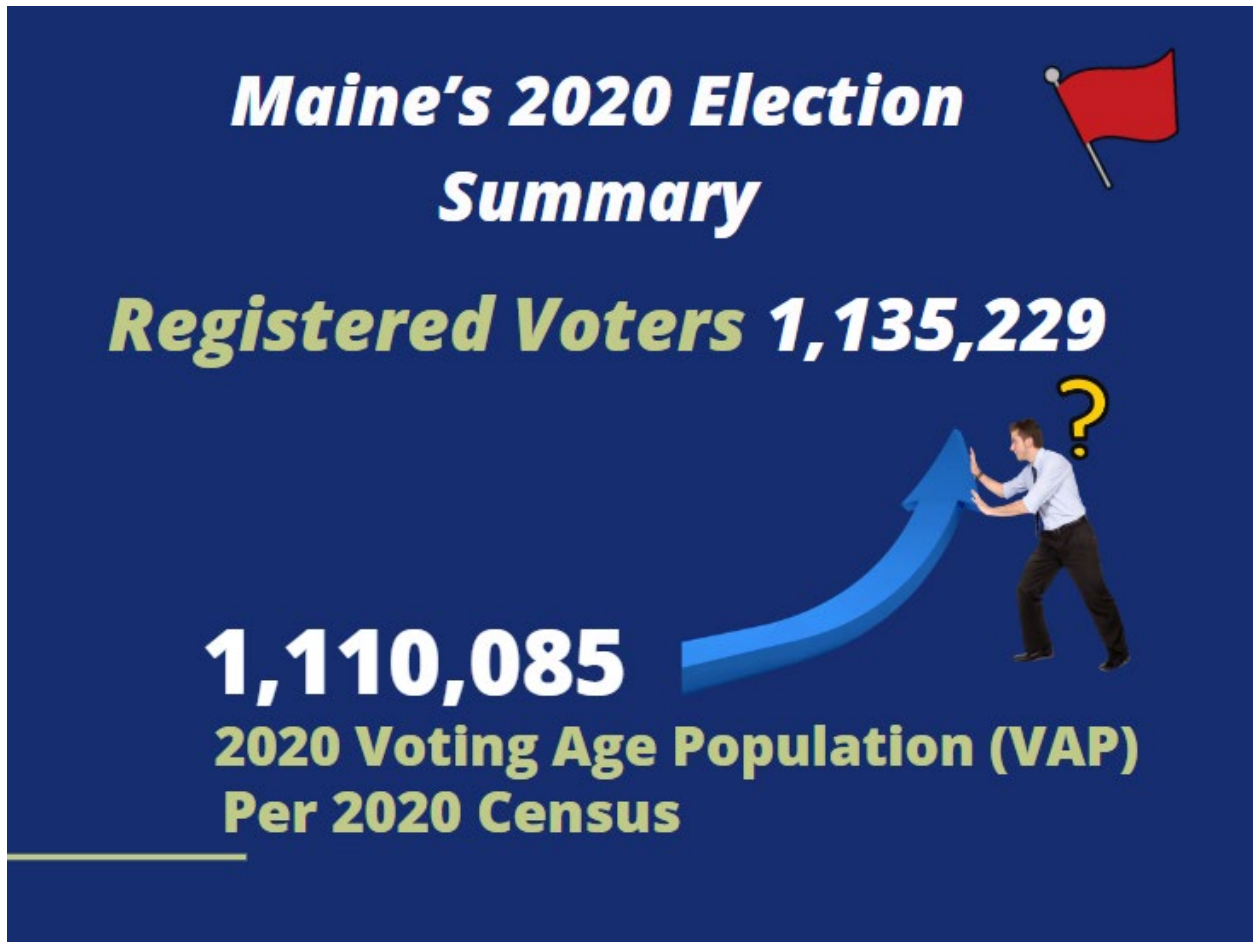
“All people are born equally free and independent, and have certain natural, inherent and unalienable rights, among which are those of enjoying and defending life and liberty, acquiring, possessing and protecting property, and pursuing and obtaining safety and happiness.”

Article 2, Section 24. Other rights not impaired.

The enumeration of certain rights shall not impair nor deny others retained by the people.

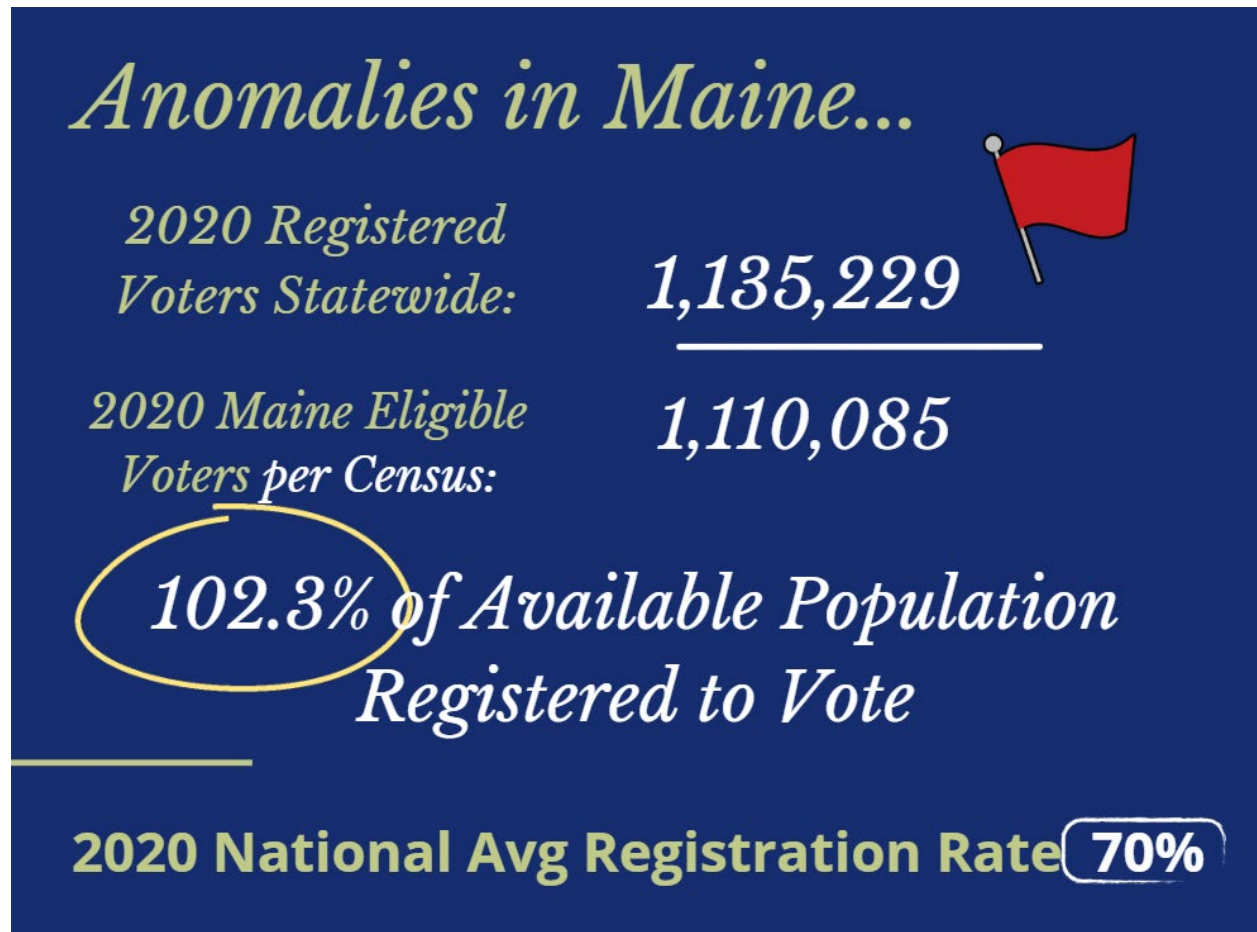
2020 Active Registered Voters Exceeded Available Voting Age Population

The following graphic represents a perplexing situation in that at the time of the 2020 election, the number of active registered voters in Maine exceeded the available voting age population as cited by the 2020 Census.



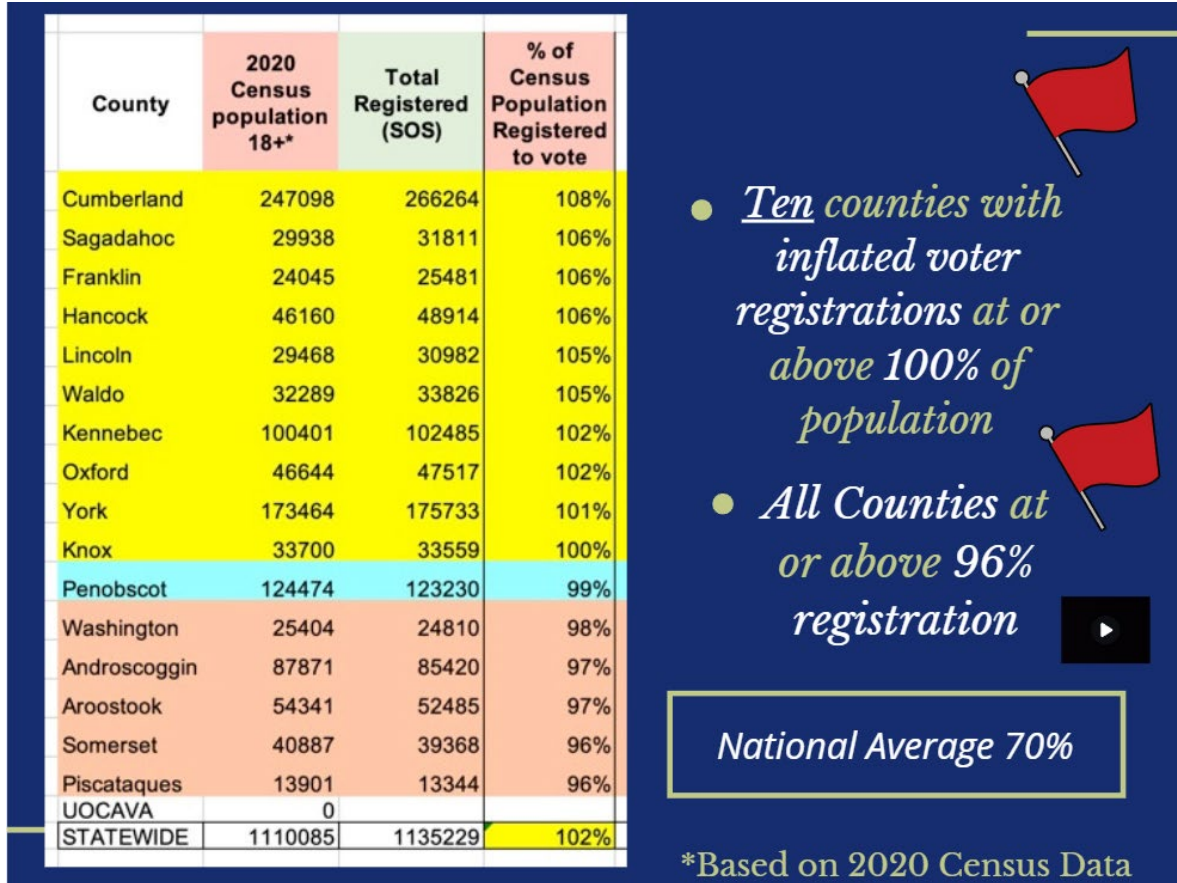
102% of Maine's Available Voting-age Population were Active Voters

At the time of the 2020 election, the national average registration rate for folks of voting age that were eligible to vote was 70%. Not only did Maine exceed that average, but we also surpassed mathematical logic with an active voter roll beyond 100%



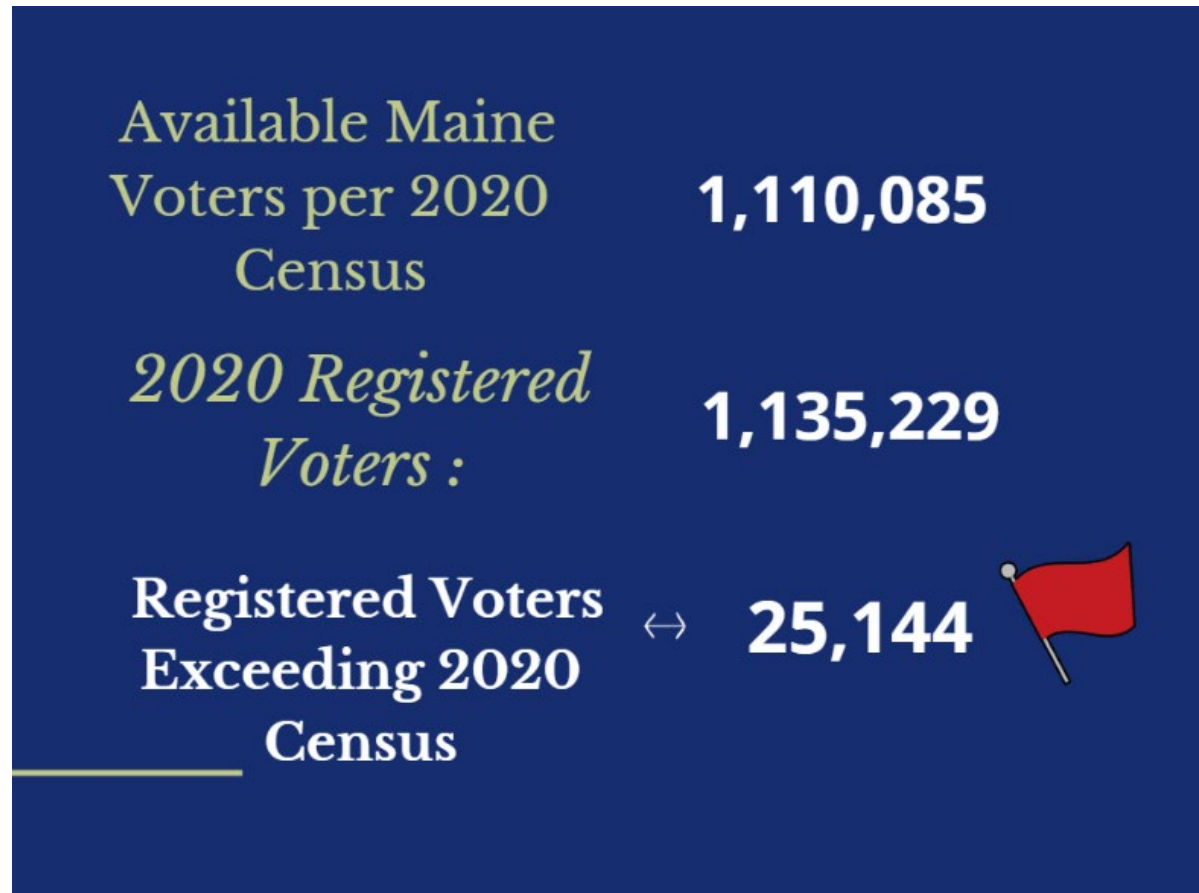
All 16 Maine Counties with Suspicious Voter Registration

All of Maine's counties exceeded the national average voter registration rate by at least 26%. Ten counties were at or above 100%.



The Potential Existed for over 25,000 Illegitimate Maine Ballots

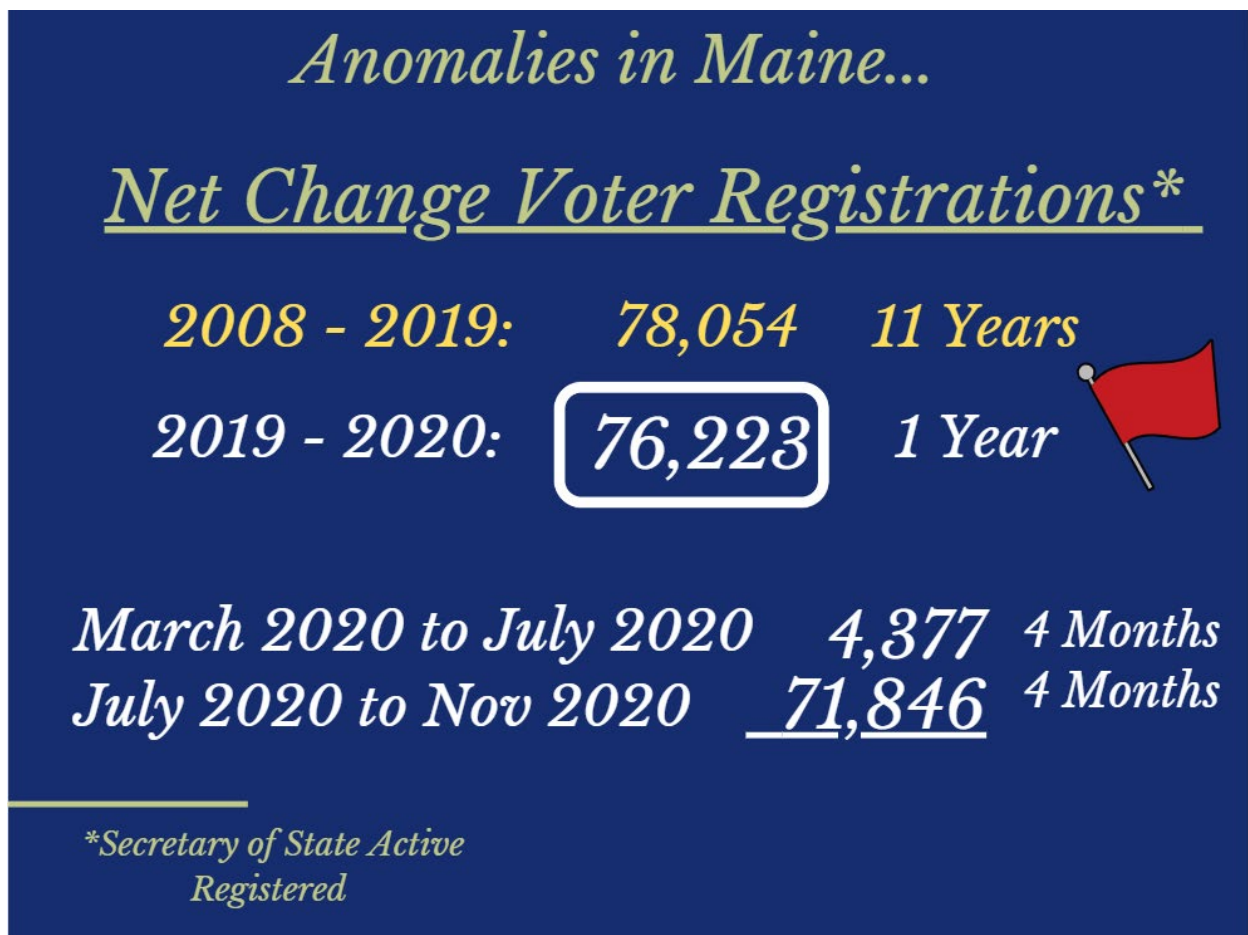
In 2020, all of Maine's counties exceeded the national average voter registration rate by at least 26%. Ten counties were at or above 100%.



Analysis of Historical Net-Change in Maine’s Active Voter Roll’s

Over the course of eleven years, from 2008 to 2019, the net-change in Maine’s voter registrations was an increase of 78,054 additional registrations. Yet over the period of one year, from 2019 to the November election in 2020, Maine experienced a whopping increase of 76,223 additional registered voters, with almost 95% of them being added in the last four months of July 2020 to November 2020.

It should be noted that Maine’s population did increase during the pandemic, however the census figures cap that at just 11,000.



2020 Ballots Cast by Maine County

According to a report produced by the non-profit, public/private MITRE organization generated under the Biden administration, a voter turnout rate at or above 72% is considered suspect.

This graphic, utilizing the Secretary of States mathematically impossible voter registration figure exceeding Maine's available voting-age population, highlights seven of the eight counties whose voter turnout surpasses the threshold of suspicion. It should be noted the voter turnout % is understated considering Maines voter rolls were artificially high.

Maine 2020 Percentage of Census Voting Age Population Registered to Vote

When applying the number of active voter registrations, reported by the Secretary of State's office, to the Census' available voting-age population in each county, we can see **nine** counties have voter registrations that exceed the available population. In addition, it should be noted that the remaining seven counties far exceed the national average voter registration rate of 70%, reported by the Census Bureau.

United States Historical Voter Turnout Voting Age Population

The Presidency Project at the University of California, Santa Barbara offers historical election data going back to 1828. In our effort to establish a reliable national voter turnout percentage, we used their data beginning with 1980 as that was the first year, they began listing the voting age population, alongside recorded registered voters.

It is important to note that for the 2020 election year, current Census reporting indicates a nationwide average voter turnout of 66.8%

Were 303,458 Excess Ballots Cast in Maine’s 2020 Presidential Election?

Surely no state meets the national average perfectly but given Maine’s inflated statewide registrations a reliance on the national average of 70% to establish a realistic estimate of Maine’s legitimately registered voters seems prudent.

In applying the national average voter-registration rate of 70% to Maine’s Census voting age population (VAP), the orange section of the graph below highlights the potential number of excess registrations the Secretary of State may have had in each county.

Similarly, in applying the Census’ 66.8% national voter-turnout average to the average voter-registration figures established above, the blue section of the graph below suggests a reasonable estimate for the existence of excessive ballots that were cast in each Maine county.

For clarity, let us focus on the data below for Cumberland County. The voting age population, per the 2020 Census was 247,098. However, Maine’s Secretary of State reported an impossible 266,264 registered voters for that county. As noted in the orange section, the national average of 70% of the voting age populace indicates that a more accurate number of registered voters for Cumberland County, to be 172,969.

Additionally, the Secretary of State indicates that 195,914 ballots were cast by voters in Cumberland County. Applying the national turnout average of 66.8% to the 172,969 registered voters established above, results in a more reasonable expected turnout of 115,543 ballots cast in this county. Therefore, we maintain the potential exists that 80,371 excess ballots may have been cast by phantom voters in Cumberland County alone.

Summary of Potential Excess Voter Registrations and Ballots Cast

In the first row of the chart below we see the Census’s voting age population for Maine in 2020 was 1,110,085. If 70% of the Census’ population registered to vote, as the national average suggests, Maine would have had about 777,060 active registered voters.

If 66.8% of those 777,060 registered voters had cast a ballot in the 2020 election, as the national average suggests, there would have been about 519,076 total ballots cast.

Making use of national averages in this way indicates the Secretary of State’s data exceeds the number of estimated reasonable registered Maine voters at the time of the 2020 election by approximately 358,170 voters. Moreover, the Secretary of State’s data exceeds the number of estimated reasonable ballots cast in the 2020 election by an astounding 303,458 ballots.

Base Data Table

The table below summarizes information provided by the Secretary of State's election website. It is a compilation of data from multiple elections of registered and enrolled reports. It should be noted that compiling this information is made difficult by the way in which the data is made available by the state. In early years, much of the data was simply presented all together in one report. In more recent years the data is separated across multiple reports which requires much effort to compile. Secondly, in attempting to access the registration data for November 2019 and June 2012 the website instead returns data for previously reported years. A request to the Secretary of State's office in the spring of 2020 to upload the proper data was made, however they have yet to do so. Additionally, despite FOAA requests to the Maine Secretary of State, we were unable to obtain election results for elections prior to November 2007 and inactive voter data prior to June 2007. The data in the table below was used in part to track the net changes in active voter registrations over time.

Net-Change in Active & Inactive Voter Registrations

To identify patterns of change, tracking of the net-change in voter registrations over time for active and inactive voters are shown here for the elections noted. The net-change is the difference between total registered active or inactive voters at the time of each election, taken from the data recorded in the “Base Data Table” above. The percentage of change represents the rate of change over time from one election to another.

Requests were made to the Secretary of State’s office to obtain active registered voter data for elections prior to January 2004, but no response was received.

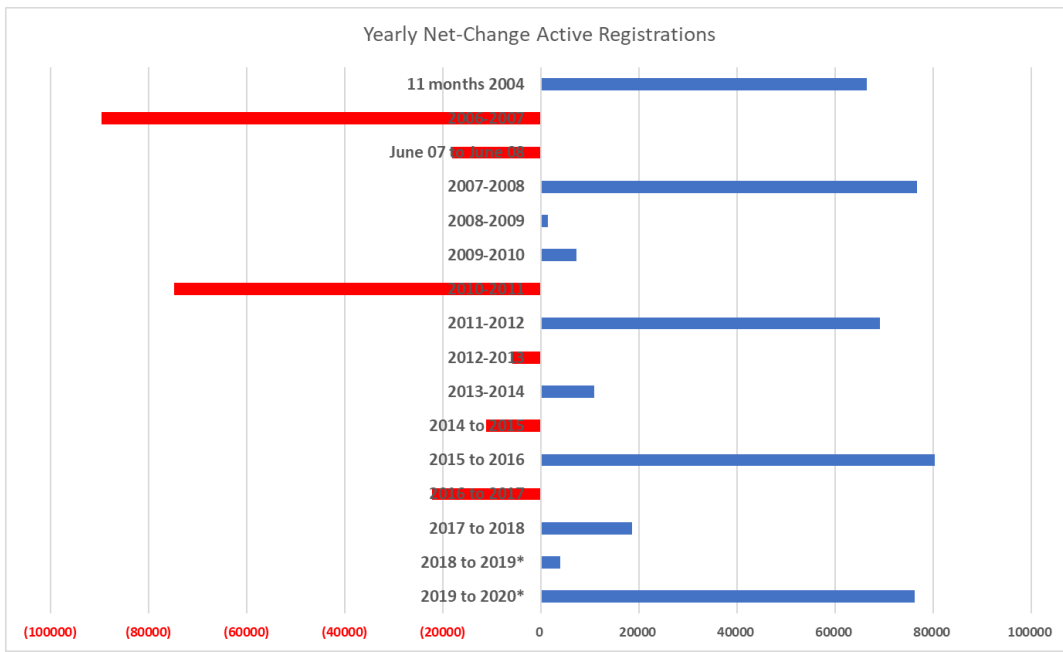
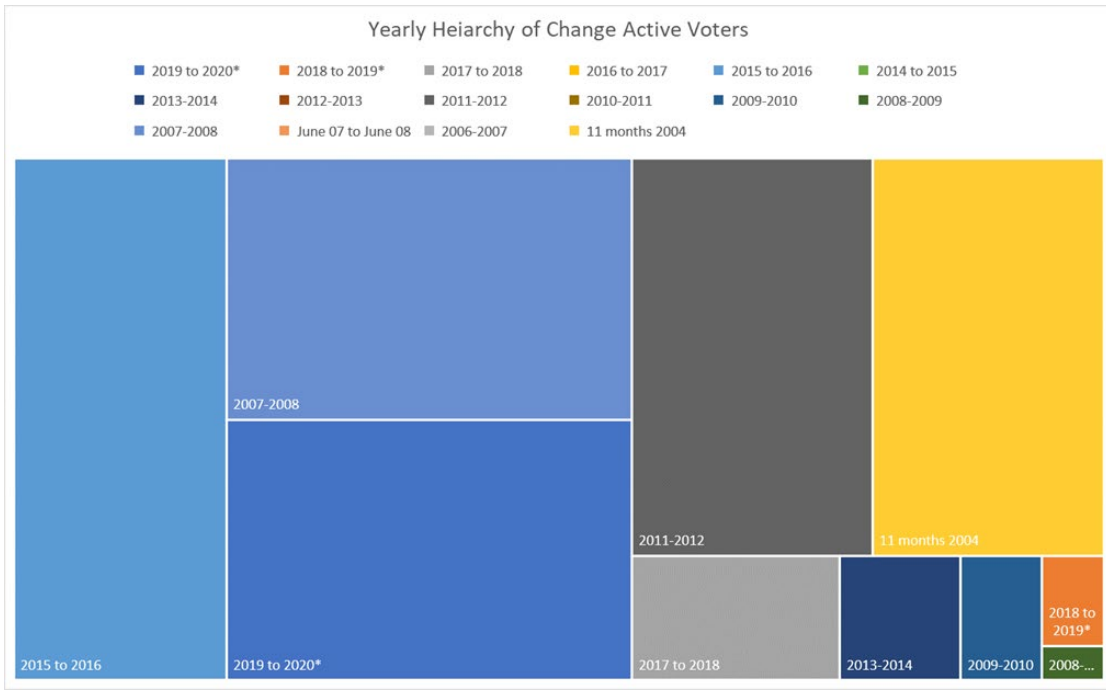

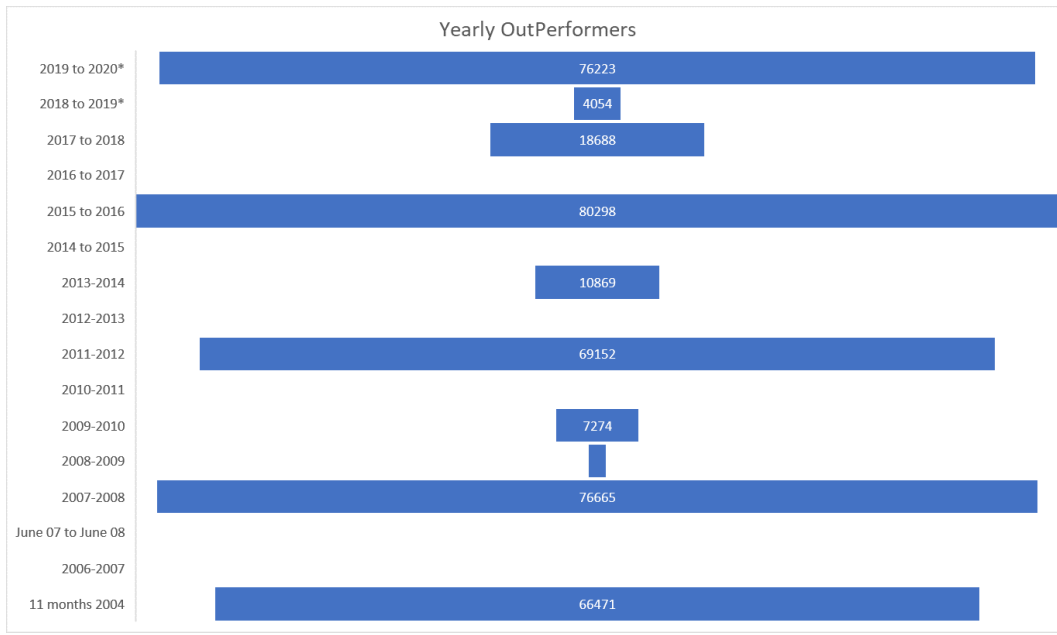

Considerations of Note:

- Are we to believe that 76,223 of the net voter registrations added in the year prior to the 2020 election occurred in the four most recent months before the election?
- Unfortunately, we are not afforded access to data that can verify over 80,000 new active registrations added in the year prior to the 2016 presidential election, 69,152 in the year prior to the 2012 presidential election, and 76,665 prior to the 2008 presidential election.
- Active voter registrations were decreased by (18,121) in the period between June 2007 & June 2008, but at the same time, inactive voter registrations increased by 99.55%, or 50,494 during that same period? That indicates that 32,282 more voters were added to inactive than were removed from the active list.
- According to the Secretary of State excerpt below, the only way for inactive status to be given is to receive back as undeliverable a change of address card. Were 50,494 change of address cards received?
 - *Only for voters who have been sent a Change of Address Confirmation Card (CACC), and (1) the card is returned by the Post Office as Undeliverable or (2) no reply is received within 20 days (if CACC was mailed to an address outside the municipality). **There is no other reason authorized by law to change a voter's status to Inactive.***
- For your convenience, listed below is an excerpt from the Division of Elections, listing the (7) reasons an active registered voter may be cancelled:
 - Voters who have requested, in writing, to be removed from the voting list.
 - Voters who have completed BMV change cards indicating a move (unless the box is checked to not use the information to update voter registration).
 - Voters who have returned responses to CACCs indicating a move outside the state or to a new municipality within the state.
 - Voters who have moved to other municipalities within the state, for whom you

have received notification through CVR.
